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1. PURPOSE

To establish the principles and guidelines governing the supply of wood-based raw materials used in the manufacture of Suzano S.A.'s products, in compliance with applicable local, national, and international legislation, as well as relevant certifications and regulatory frameworks.

3. TERMS, DEFINITIONS AND ABBREVIATIONS

3.1 Certification Abbreviations

- FSC® (FSC-C010014): Forest Stewardship Council®

3.2 High Conservation Value (HCV)

Forest areas containing biological, ecological, social, or cultural values of outstanding or critical importance that must be maintained or enhanced. These values are grouped into six categories,

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including rare biodiversity, threatened ecosystems, essential ecosystem services, community needs, and cultural significance.

3.3 Conversion

Permanent change of natural forest cover caused by human or non-human activity, including both gradual forest degradation and rapid forest transformation.

3.4 Deforestation

Removal or conversion of native vegetation or natural forest cover, caused by human or non-human activity, resulting in a permanent change in land use.

4. GUIDELINES

4.1 Scope

This Policy applies to land acquisition and leasing, Suzano's own forestry operations, third-party wood sourcing, swap arrangements, and supply partnerships.

4.2 Principles

Suzano ensures that all wood used in its production processes originates from legal, traceable, and responsible sources, aligned with the following principles:

- a) Compliance with all applicable national and international legislation
- b) Identification of wood origin and full traceability throughout the supply chain
- c) Respect for legitimate ownership, tenure, and land-use rights
- d) Respect for human rights
- e) Assurance of workers' rights, including occupational health and safety rights, in line with the fundamental principles of the International Labour Organization (ILO)
- f) Protection of the rights of Indigenous Peoples, quilombola communities, and other traditional communities
- g) Protection and enhancement of High Conservation Value (HCV) attributes
- h) Compliance with internationally recognized forest certification standards for Forest Management, Chain of Custody, and Controlled Wood (FSC®, PEFC, SFI®, and/or ATFS)

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4.3 Public Commitment and Transparency

Suzano is committed to zero deforestation and to the adoption of best practices in responsible forest management.

The Company commits to establishing plantations in Brazil and sourcing wood exclusively from previously converted land, where any land-use change occurred prior to July 23, 2020.

Any limited vegetation removal required to ensure public safety or meet specific operational needs will be carried out transparently and in full compliance with legal authorizations issued by the competent authorities.

Progress toward this commitment in Brazil is reported annually in the Zero Deforestation Report, available through Suzano's Sustainability Center.

4.4 Implementation

Suzano adopts the following procedures to ensure the effective implementation of this Policy:

- Conducting environmental and social due diligence for land to be acquired and/or leased, wood suppliers and business partners, including document reviews, field assessments and, where applicable, the development of corrective action plans.
- Encouraging wood suppliers to obtain FSC®, PEFC, SFI®, and/or ATFS certification.
- Ongoing monitoring and internal and external audits conducted by nationally and internationally accredited certification bodies.
- Adoption of specific controls for controlled wood and controlled sources, according to country risk classification and certification scheme requirements.
- Engagement processes to ensure the social legitimacy of operations through long-term relationships with neighboring communities and other stakeholders, integrating their interests into forest business management.

5. RESPONSABILITIES

The Sustainability, Procurement, and Forestry departments are responsible for the development, review, implementation, and dissemination of this Policy.

6. POLICY APPROVAL

This Policy remains in effect indefinitely as of the date of its approval by the Executive Vice Presidency of Suzano S.A.

The Executive Vice Presidency of Suzano S.A. has exclusive authority to amend this Policy under any circumstances.

Note: If necessary, copies of decisions regarding amendments or revisions of this Policy may be shared with stakeholders.

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7. POLICY VIOLATION

Appropriate corrective measures may be applied, including fines and contract termination, involving wood suppliers or forestry, harvesting, and logistics service providers.

8. FINAL CONSIDERATIONS

This Policy was developed based on best available practices in responsible forest management, aiming to minimize socio-environmental impacts while ensuring compliance with applicable legislation and standards, including:

- Brazilian Forest Code and related environmental legislation
- FSC® Policy for Association criteria
- Forest Management and Chain of Custody standards
- EUTR (European Union Timber Regulation)
- EUDR (European Union Deforestation Regulation)

As well as international agreements such as:

- CITES (Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora)
- ILO (International Labour Organization)
- ITTA (International Tropical Timber Agreement)
- CBD (Convention on Biological Diversity)

Suzano reinforces that genetically modified trees are used exclusively in controlled areas dedicated to research.
